Advising & Registration

Located in Melvill Hall, the UW-Richland Office of Student Services is open 7:45am – 4:30pm each weekday and until 6pm on Mondays. Here you'll find assistance with admissions, registration and advising. The Student Services Office also includes a Resource Center for your use as you explore careers, transfer campuses, financial aid and more.

Financial Aid

Summer financial aid availability is limited to the Direct Stafford Student Loan and Pell Grant programs for students with eligibility. For financial aid purposes summer is considered the "third term" of the 2011-2012 academic year. If you attend another campus and are enrolling at UW-Richland just for the summer, contact your Financial Aid Office to discuss the possibility of a Consortium Agreement for summer financial aid. Credit transfer

All courses offered as part of the UW-Richland summer program will transfer to other UW System campuses—and to other campuses as well. See the course equivalency chart in this bulletin for UW system equivalency information.

Application

If you wish to enroll in a summer course at UW-Richland this year, follow these basic steps:

- **CURRENTLY ENROLLED UW-RICHLAND STUDENT?**

You do NOT need to complete another application form. You may register for summer classes via your PRISM account once the \$50 Advance Tuition Deposit has been paid.

- **WILL BE A NEW UW-RICHLAND STUDENT IN THE FALLOF '12 and already have an application on file?** You do NOT need to complete a separate summer application. Upon notification from you, we will make the necessary adjustments in your file and you'll be able to register for summer coursework with the assistance of an advisor. - **ATTENDING COLLEGE ELSEWHERE?** If you are enrolling only during the summer session, be sure to complete the UW Colleges Special Student Application form. Printed application forms are available by contacting UW-Richland Student Services or apply online at "Apply Online," a link on the UW-Richland home page at richland.uwc.edu. You may also want to check the course equivalency at your "home" campus (see Course Equivalency Table) and discuss any summer coursework here with your advisor there.

Final Exam Schedule

A final examination will be part of your summer course(s). A Final Exam Day has been assigned, but be sure to check your course syllabus to verify whether or not your professor will use the designated exam day.

IMPORTANT NOTES REGARDING THE TRANSFER CHART:

1. The transfer equivalency information listed above comes from the UW System's Transfer Information System (TIS) available on the web at: www.uwsa.edu/tis. You may want to check TIS for more detailed information regarding transferability of these classes.
2. Equivalency information regarding online courses is available via the TIS website.
3. While transfer equivalency information may indicate "elective," it is important to note that a course will typically apply in its general education breadth category; in other words, History 208 is indicated as an History Elective at all of the UW institutions. A closer look in TIS will show that they accept this course as a Humanities or Social Science course in their general education breadth area. Check TIS for information as to how your campus will transfer "elective" classes in terms of general education.
4. *English 281 is a "special topics" course which means the course could be developed to focus on a different topic in different semesters. The course will transfer as a literature/humanities course, BUT IT WILL BE important for students to have a copy of the syllabus for the transfer campus so they are able to make a decision as to the course designations.
