Enclosed are your class assignments. On that letter, please verify that we spelled your name correctly for your name tag and that we have the right T-shirt size listed for you. If there are any problems, contact our registrar at (608) 647-6186 X227.

On the reverse of this information sheet is a list of what to bring listed by class. Also enclosed is a permission form for field trips for the classes that require one (The Court Will Come to Order, Off the Hook and Club Kayak). On the reverse of your class assignment letter is a campus map. Look over all these items, retain the map for when you come, and review these general rules with your parents:

- NO RUNNING!
- Wear your name badge at all times – every day.
- Do not litter.
- Know where you will be picked up or met at the end of the day.
- If you have asthma and need an inhaler please have it with you at all times.

### Opening Day – Monday July 20

On Monday, July 20, you should arrive at UW-Richland by 8 am and go straight to the gym. If you are traveling by car you may be dropped off or park in the East Parking lot. If you are coming by bus you will be dropped off in the West Parking lot. (Remember to return to the same lot when it is time to go home.) There will be people and signs to direct you to and from the parking lots.

When you get to the gym, if you have not already done so, please say goodbye outside and verify where you will meet after classes with the adult who brought you.

Name tags will be in the gym on tables arranged in alphabetical order by the first letter of your last name. Your name badge will have your classes listed on it, in case you don't recall which one is first. Take YOUR NAME BADGE and find the banner on the wall for your first class. You will meet your teacher there and get the string for wearing your name badge – PLEASE WEAR IT EVERY DAY! Once your teacher has marked you for attendance, sit on the bleachers behind the teacher. **You will receive your T-shirt in your first class.** You may wear your College for Kids T-shirt as much as you like, but we ask that you especially to **wear it on the last day.**

At 10 am there will be a break – on the first day all the classes will return to the gym for the break and sit on the bleachers with the teacher of your second class. At 11:45 you will be done for the day and proceed to the parking lots to be picked up. (Be sure you know where you will meet after classes.)

### Lunch

Only those students staying for Middle School U meet in the cafeteria to eat their lunch from home or from the cafeteria if it is pre-ordered. All other students depart at this time.

### Tuesday through Friday

Please arrive by 8:30, but no earlier than 8:15 am. Do not enter any buildings until 8:30. After break do not enter again until 10:15 so that teachers can use this time to prepare. Breaks Tuesday through Friday will be on the north side of the cafeteria (your teacher will guide you there the first time).

### Attendance

We expect students to attend every day to get the full benefit of the program; however, if for any reason you will be absent, please let the office know in advance at (608) 647-6186 X227. If you are sick, please stay home to avoid spreading any illness through the group. (Hand sanitizer will be in each room and hand washing before snacks encouraged.)

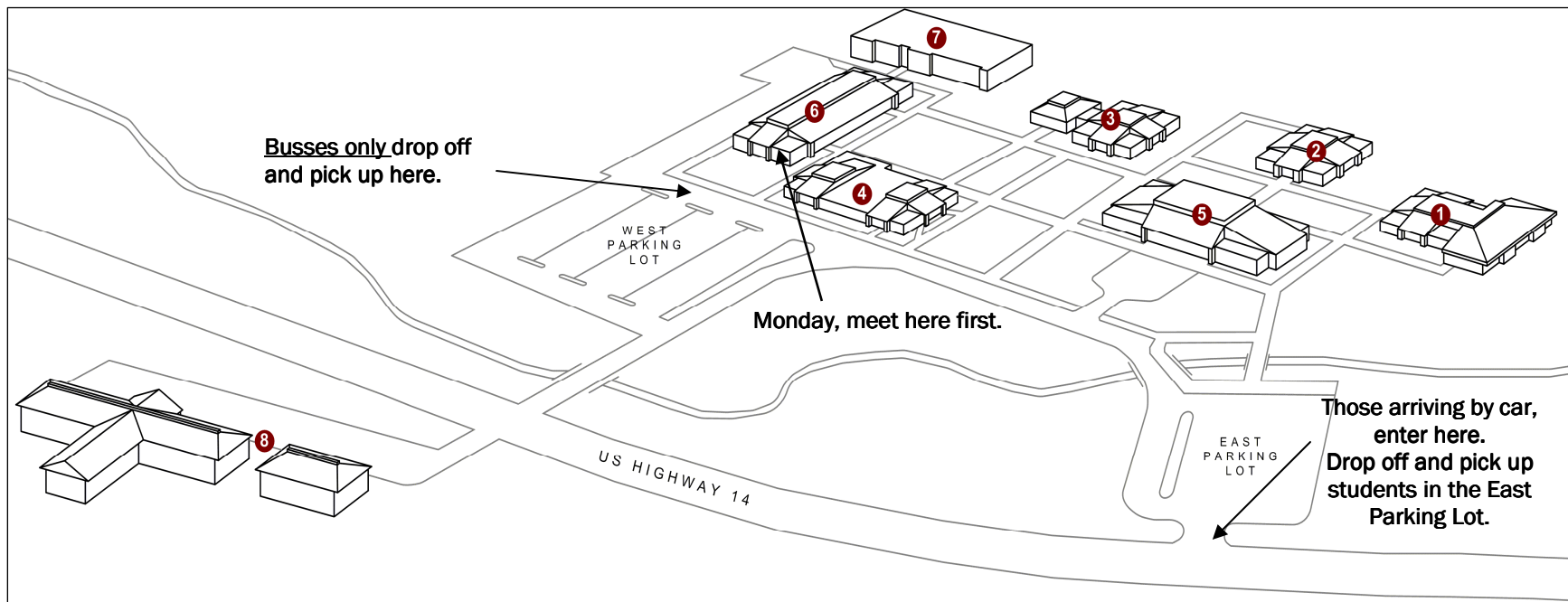
